# Policy Working Group Vision

## What is the end goal of the HIT initiative?

- Establish high-impact tutoring as a permanent academic intervention method in NYC with consistent funding streams into the foreseeable future.

## What is the purpose of the Policy Working Group?

- Identify potential & draft policies that promote scaling and sustaining high-impact tutoring across NYCPS.

## How does the Policy Working Group differ from the Community of Practice?

- Conversations will be centered on policy & advocacy
- Works in tandem with the CoP to allow implementation knowledge and practice to inform policy.

# What do we expect to achieve?

## Memos

- Outline the importance of HIT and the efficacy of the NYCPS <> ExpandedED Schools model.

## White Paper Research

- Consideration of how to fund HIT in NYC post-ESSER.
  - What funding streams already exist? How can they be leveraged for HIT programming?
  - What funding streams can be established? And which stakeholders will need to be engaged?

## Advocacy Briefs

- Recommendation including the options of how HIT can be structured and funded in NYC.
  - Will publish in 2025.
