EXAMPLE: [New York City launched a high-impact tutoring (HIT) pilot in 2022 to combat the instructional losses from COVID that exacerbated inequities in our City's education system. The model is grounded in a strong evidence base from the Brown University Annenberg Institute showing the benefits and key implementation markers of high-impact tutoring, defined as tutoring that happens more than three days per week for more than 90 minutes per week, with no more than four students at a time per tutor, using quality instructional materials and data to assess progress. This is one of the few school-based intervention models that yields large positive impacts on student achievement in literacy and math. The New York City HIT model has citywide standards and implementation rubrics used to ensure high-quality implementation and strong outcomes. The program prioritizes students who have the least access to high-quality tutoring and is focused on K-2 literacy and 6-8 math, two areas where high-impact tutoring has had the strongest outcomes.

The program currently serves 125 schools across 12 districts, and is ready to expand to serve more schools in more districts if there is adequate public funding. ExpandED's facilitation is supported by private funds. The first two years of the pilot were supported by \$10M in ESSER COVID relief funds from the New York City Department of Education (DOE, also known as New York City Public Schools). The third year of the pilot was supported by \$4M in New York City Council funds. In each case, those funds were distributed through the DOE to schools, which then contracted with a vetted list of tutoring providers. New York City can continue with that distribution mechanism or distribute funds via ExpandED, given our expertise as a funding intermediary.]
